My favorite memories of Mike will always revolve around the annual Kid's Model Building Class. Although he and Katie never had children, Mike truly enjoyed working with them. He loved building models one-on-one with the kids, especially the youngest ones. Watching him coax little kids into talking about their models in front of a large group was always a highlight of the class. I didn't know that he coached for the Lovejoy T-Ball team too, but it's fun to imagine him and little kids with bats.

Old friend Frank Ciccarella summed it up pretty well, saying "For those of us who knew Mike, we will be grateful for the time we had together with him."





### Notes From The December Meeting Dick Schulenberg


President Tony Gliszczynski started off the meeting with a little bit of regular business and some reminders.

Brian McFee brought in his 48th scale Hasegawa F-4J Phantom 2 work in progress. He's building a bird that was transferred from the US. Navy to the RAF with markings for #74 Tiger Squadron. The cockpit sports True Details ejection seats and an interesting light blue exterior paint job with a black tail.

Alan Gryfe brought in two work in progress truck conversion projects that he was inspired to do from a Motorific Magazine Issue. One was an Opel Blitz chassis under a 55' Chevy pickup cab and the other was a Ford C Series cab over on top of a Monogram garbage truck hot rod. I hope I got this right Alan! Can you tell I'm not a car guy?

Larry Osolkowski brought in a kit he plans to be his NOREASTCON 2009 entry, a 1/24th scale kit from Model

Factory HIRO of the Aston Martin DBR9 that ran in the 2006 Le Mans. He managed to acquire the proper grayish green metallic paint for the car from Cobra Colors. The brake rotors have four layers of photo etch and the wheels are made of CNC'd aluminum. Larry had to use an etching primer to get the magnesium paint coating to stick to the aluminum. He used paint from a traditional spray can in an airbrush by using a straw taped to the spray can and shooting into a cup with the other end of the straw cut so that it splays in four directions to let the paint out more slowly. Neat idea Larry. It sounds like a must try.



Peter Gajowka brought in some kits from ICM and Eduard he acquired while in Poland. He said they were particularly good buys because of the exchange rate and the details were pretty good too. He had an M3 Stuart light tank kit featuring British Cavalry markings and an ICM Russian LaGG 3 fighter in 48th scale as well as an Eduard Grumman F6F-3 Hellcat fighter.



Jeff Belling brought in a 1/144 scale Academy kit of the Consolidated B-24 Liberator he finished in the markings of its pilot, who Jeff knows. Jeff gave it an N scale crew and looks forward to presenting the model to the pilot who is still active in Jeff's local community. A wonderful and thoughtful idea Jeff. I bet we all can think of someone who would like a model of the plane or vehicle they worked on or piloted.

Tom Brown brought in some 1/300 scale cannons he made for the Fort Niagara Diorama by using a lit magnifying glass. See Tom if you would like to help.

He also scratch built the floor from quarter inch plywood as well as the walls and made a chandelier from stir sticks with candles made from straw, guitar string, and a brass washer. The individual stone look of the floor and walls was done with woodworking tools. Like many of Dave's models and dioramas, he uses simple craft paint that can be found at any craft store. Great ingenuity Dave.

Steve Weller got the modeling spirit flowing again by starting with something simple and small, a 1/76th scale Fujimi T-34 Model 1941 Tank. Steve reports that the rubber band tracks were a real nightmare to try to fasten in place. He finished it with a winter white wash scheme. Looks nice Steve.


