The 1/300 Fort Niagara diorama project is nearly complete. The deliver date is set for June 28 (successfully delivered - ed). The buildings are placed and groundwork, painting and detailing is going on. The ships and lots of details are ready to install. Three dimensional 1/350 cast resin figures are being painted and placed. The case is under construction and we're right down to the wire now. Frank Blonski brought in a neat set of photos to give everyone an idea where we are. For all the work involved, this really has been a fun project.

Mark Gdak and his young son Jacob dropped in for a visit. Mark enjoys building 1/32 scale aircraft. Nice to meet them both.

The Around the Room Question was a two-parter: "What demo would you like to see <u>and</u> what demo can you present." Here are the responses:

Armor weathering; working under a magnifier; making rivets; scratch building techniques for details (Joe Szczygiel); airbrushing (maybe offsite); scratch building car stuff (Frank Blonski); resin casting (Mark Budniewski); ship weathering; painting 54mm figures; panel washes; painting hard & soft edges; weathering with oils; natural metals (Dave Schwab); modeling knee high grass (Matt Keysa); weathering with filters; chipped and scraped paint; lighting models (Dave Armitage); using liquid glues; seam filling; cockpit interior detailing; seams in large scale ship decks; working with Future (Brian McFee); prep for painting; reworking figures; trees from "stuff"; making ropes for model ships (Paul Hines). We'll see how we can make this work.

There were some interesting models on the display tables. Here goes:



July 2009

John Doerr - the new 1/48 Airfix Martin B-57B, along with selected resin parts from the Classic Airframes kit. The combination should be relatively easy to build and well detailed. Looking forward to seeing this one.

Paul Hines – large scale Seguin tug built from the Blue Jacket kit. Paul built the plank on frame kit in the post-World War II configuration, adding interior details and weathering with an airbrush, washes and pastels. Paul fitted the signal flags that were flown on Seguin's last voyage.

Tom Brown – a real mixed bag of stuff. First some corded wood piles and an oxcart with straw for the Ft. Niagara diorama and full scale models of several handguns, a .44 Smith & Weston Magnum and a long barreled .357. Tom bought them partially assembled and rebuilt them.


Eric Hillebrand - a Hasegawa 1/35 Kubelwagen, a very nice curbside model.
