






November 2009

Justen Hanna showed his 1/48 Eduard Albatross and a 1/48 P-51 Mustang of the 1st Air Command.






November 2009








November 2009

Ron Mikol finished his 1969 Dodge Dart with silver, candy yellow, candy red, and bare-metal foil. He detailed it with black webbing.






