Of special note are the metallic colors of the pistons and shells that Jason achieved using AK's new True Metal metallic waxes, a similar product to the venerable Rub and Buff line. 

John Walker's 54mm Continental Marine (Imrie-Risley), built mainly OOB, although the figure was refined slightly by separating the musket from the hat brim. Paints are Vallejo and craft acrylics. The figure depicts a Marine on New Providence Island, The Bahamas, April 1776. American forces staged a raid on Nassau during March 1776 with the objective of seizing gunpowder and munitions known to be stored there. The raid, sometimes known as the Battle of Nassau, was one of the first engagements of the Continental Navy and Marines, and it was the Marines' first amphibious assault.

Pip Moss's 1:48 scale Hawker Sea Fury FB.11 (Airfix). Pip used an Eduard photo-etch set for the instrument panel and seat belts. Main wheels and propeller spinner are resin items from Barracuda. The kit's two-piece, ill fitting engine cowling was replaced by a single resin part from Aerocraft. (Barracuda also produces one, which may be more accessible for American modelers.) Paints for the camouflage colors of Extra Dark Sea Grey and Sky are Mr. Color acrylic lacquers. Being impervious to standard paint thinner, these paints allowed the easy application of Tamiya black Panel Line Accent Color to bring out the lines and add some subtle grime. Decals are from an excellent Barracuda sheet (printed by Cartograf). Markings are for Sea Fury serial WJ233, which flew with Royal Navy 801 Squadron aboard USS Ocean during the Korean War. One of the fastest piston-engine fighters ever built, and the last to serve with the Royal Navy, the Sea Fury had a top speed of 460 mph and proved itself a formidable attack plane even as jets were taking over the skies.

On August 9, 1952, Sub-Lieutenant Paul "Shmoo" Ellis was flying WJ233 as part of an attack formation led by Lt. Peter Carmichael. The group spotted a number of MiG-15 jet fighters approaching them from above and engaged them. During the melee, one MiG was shot down and several others damaged. Although Carmichael was given credit for the kill, it was actually Ellis who emptied his guns into the MiG. You can read Ellis's account of the incident here:



John stripped the figure down and rebuilt it with new weapons, haversack, canteen, etc. He writes, "The figure was crude, so I used a dental burr to redefine head, hands, etc." Paints are Vallejo and craft acrylics. The model depicts a musketman from the Maryland State Troops somewhere around New York City in 1776.
